Bin 103 Banfi Cantine Sauvignon Blanc/Pinot Grigio/Chard 2009/2010, Toscana Italy \$21 Glass \$6.75
What the critics thought: Wine Enthusiast 87 points—This fresh white wine from Tuscany opens with loads of citrus and peach followed by an easy compact mouth-feel.

Bin 108 Movendo Moscato N/V, Emilia Italy \$21 Glass \$6.50
What the critics thought: A Cobblestone Selection—Hints of flowers, pears and apricot; luscious and fruity with a great vein of acidity.

Bin 124 Le Rime Pinot Grigio 2010, Veneto Italy \$21 Glass \$6.75
What the critics thought: Wine Spectator 88 points—Fruity and delicate bouquet with scents of apple and pear. Dry with a fresh taste.

Bin 129 Chateau Ste Michelle Canoe Ridge Chardonnay 2008 Horse Heaven Hills WA \$32
What the critics thought: Wine Spectator 90 points—This elegant and refined wine exhibits fresh apple, pear, and light spice aromas.

Bin 118 Sebastiani Chardonnay 2009, Sonoma California \$25 Glass \$7.75
What the critics thought: Wine Enthusiast 91 points—A Grapevine Favorite! Delicious and zesty, filled with pineapple, pear, green apple, honey and oak, wrapped into a texture of butter cream with a long spicy finish.

Bin 109 Valley of the Moon Unoaked Chardonnay 2010, Russian River Valley CA \$23 Glass \$7.25
What the critics thought: Wine Enthusiast 88 points—Opulent, with pineapples, green apples, pears, bananas, mangoes, limes, honey and vanilla.

Bin 105 Concannon Conservancy Chardonnay 2009/2010, Livermore Valley California \$22 Glass \$7.00
What the critics thought: Wine Enthusiast 90 points—Ripe, rich, and an amazing deal. It starts with nose of slight oak and citrus, then dances with intense layers of pear, vanilla and caramel toffee.

Bin 123 Snoqualmie Chardonnay 2010, Columbia Valley Washington \$21 Glass \$6.75
What the critics thought: A Cobblestone Selection—Soft and buttery with good balance and fresh flavors of apple and lime.

Bin 113 Mountain View White Zinfandel 2010, California \$17 Glass \$5.75
What the critics thought: A Cobblestone Selection—A real crowd pleaser; crisp bright flavors and fresh fruit aromas of strawberry & cherry. It drinks more like a rose.

- Bin 104 A to Z Pinot Noir 2009 Oregon \$38
What the critics thought: Wine Spectator 90 points—Balanced and refreshing with pretty raspberry and cherry flavors playing against hints of spice and chalk. Finishes with impressive length.
- Bin 130 J Lohr Falcon's Perch Pinot Noir 2009, Monterey California \$28 Glass \$8.75
What the critics thought: A Cobblestone Selection—Very fruity, offering a burst of raspberries and cherries, with sweet, smoky oak, crisp acidity and smooth, silky tannins provide a balanced structure
- Bin 102 Rodney Strong Estate Vineyards Pinot Noir 2009 Russian River California \$27 Glass \$8.50
What the critics thought: Wine Enthusiast 91 points— Made in a leaner, drier, lighter style with elegance and complexity; herbal notes and sour cherry candy fruit, balanced with perfect acidity.
- Bin 136 Castle Rock Pinot Noir 2009, Willamette Valley Oregon \$22 Glass \$7.00
What the critics thought: Connoisseurs Guide 87 points— Flavors of berries, cinnamon, black cherries, and sweet vanilla oak dance with floral notes and offer a long, velvety finish.

What the critics thought: Wine Spectator 88 points—Smooth and round, brimming with cherry and tobacco flavors, a savory edge adding depth to the open-textured freshness.
- Bin 128 Stonecap Merlot 2009, Columbia Valley Washington \$24 Glass \$7.50
What the critics thought: Wine Enthusiast 88 points Top 100 Best Buys—A delicious bottle, estate-grown fruit. Lots of pretty cherry fruit, wrapped in smooth, chocolaty tannins.

Zinfandel

- Bin 119 Murphy Goode Liar's Dice Zinfandel 2008, Sonoma California \$41
What the critics thought: Wine & Spirits 90 points —Portion of sales of Murphy Goode wines go to Operation Homefront (benefitting families of US Military). Sweet and juicy with big flavors of black raspberry and blackberry jam balanced by bold tannins and acidity.
- Bin 131 Bonterra Zinfandel 2008, Mendocino California \$25 Glass \$7.50
What the critics thought: Wine Enthusiast 90 points —Deeply flavored in dark stone fruits and berries. And then there are the freshly crushed peppercorns, black, red, green and white.

Shiraz

- Bin 134 The Chook Shiraz/Viognier 2009, Sonoma California \$34
What the critics thought: Wine Advocate 90 points—Intense cherry and crushed blackberry aromas with an enticing fruity lift and just a touch of peachiness, medium-full bodied palate, finishing long.
- Bin 101 Layer Cake Shiraz 2009, Southeastern Australia \$29 Glass \$9.00
What the critics thought: Wine Enthusiast 91 points —A Grapevine Favorite! Full-on Shiraz, loaded with plum and black cherry fruit, warm and velvety on the finish.
- Bin 132 Woop Woop Shiraz 2010, South Australia \$23 Glass \$7.25
What the critics thought: Connoisseurs Guide 89 points— Lush, and deep, vivid flavors of black and blue fruits and a gently smoky oak influence. Finishes with soft tannins and good smoky persistence.

What the critics thought: A Cobblestone Selection—Blackberry, earth and a hint of barbecue spice, this wine exhibits great fruit, delicious, full-bodied texture, silky tannins, and a long finish.

Bin 111 Dona Paula Malbec 2010, Mendoza Argentina \$27 Glass \$8.50
What the critics thought: A Cobblestone Selection—Intense violet color; plums, black cherries, licorice and dried herb aromas in the nose. Sweet, round and ample in the mouth, with a lingering fin-

What the critics thought: Wine & Spirits 90 Points Gold Medal—Wild cherry, pepper, and oak aromas with soft tannins

What the critics thought: Wine Advocate 90 points— Enticing nose of lightly roasted red fruits, creme de cassis, and red licorice. Dense, super-ripe, concentrated; mouth-filling remarkable bargain

Bin 121 Columbia Crest Amitage Red Blend 2008, Columbia Valley Washington \$22 Glass \$7.00
What the critics thought: Wine Spectator 89 points— Merlot, Syrah, Cabernet Franc, Cabernet Sauvignon and Malbec. Currant and plum against hints of coffee and smoke, refined tannins pulling together seamlessly.

Bin 117 Concannon Conservancy Petite Sirah 2008, Livermore Valley California \$22 Glass \$7.00
What the critics thought: Wine Enthusiast 88 points— Opens with a nose of pepper and mocha, stewed berry and plum and develops into a full body that's lush and oaky.

Bin 126 Tamas Double Decker Red Cabernet/Petite Sirah/Barbera 2008, California \$21 Glass \$6.75
What the critics thought: Wine Enthusiast 85 points— An exciting blend with flavors of blackberry, black cherry and plum.

What the critics thought: Wine Enthusiast 90 points— Rich and seductive in blackberry, raspberry, cherry, cola and cocoa flavors, wrapped into softly gentle tannins.

What the critics thought: A Cobblestone Selection—Engaging and layered aromas of blackberry and dark plum with hints of spice, cedar, and vanilla.
